THE SEMANTOGRAPHY SERIES grew from a number of leaflets, pamphlets and brochures which the author printed or mimeographed. Librarians showed interest in these publications and some of them gave a standing advance order for future publications. This prompted the author to include in the Series the text of university and other public lectures on Semantography, courses, controversies and important correspondences showing further applications and extensions of Semantography. Some of these correspondences with institutions and scholars are interesting from the historical point of view, showing the initial difficulties encountered by this idea.
