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This book is a short cut to the 3 books on Semantography. It deals with the problems. It shows 100 symbol elements, and some of their variations, derivations and combinations, but it does not show their applications in the many fields in science, industry, commerce, communication, education, etc. These are treated in detail in the 3 books. The Synopsis shows however how the Logic and Semantics of Semantography is applied to utterances in the home, the papers, the parliaments, the political platforms, etc. It exposes the falsehoods of demagogues and dictators. Semantography may provoke a revolution in speech and thought.
